- 9. Indigenous Location
- 10. Geographic
- 11. Proximity to Labour Market
- 12. Mode of Transport to Work
- 13. Phone Contactability
- 14. Disability/Medical Conditions
- 15. Residence Stability
- 16. Living Arrangements
- 17. Ex-offender Status
- 18. Personal Factors
