### Question

## **National Schools Special Purpose Payments**

In reference to the \$18billion program, National Schools Special Purpose Payments, can you detail how much of that funding is allocated to Tasmania and what it is to be spent on?

#### Answer

Supporting the National Education Agreement, the National Schools Specific Purpose Payments (SPP) provide Commonwealth funding to the states and territories to support government and non-government schools.

The National Education Agreement contributes to the following outcomes:

- all children are engaged in and benefiting from schooling
- young people are meeting basic literacy and numeracy standards, and overall levels of literacy and numeracy achievements are improving
- Australian students excel by international standards
- schooling promotes the social inclusion and reduces the educational disadvantage of children, especially Indigenous children
- young people make a successful transition from work to further study.

Page 49 of the 2011–12 Commonwealth Budget Paper 3 (Australia's Federal Relations) provides a breakdown of the National Schools SPP. For Tasmania the funding (in millions) is:
