Question

Participation Rates For Low-Ses Enrolments

Senator MASON: Indeed. Do we have much data on this, Mr Hazlehurst, in terms of participation rates for low-SES enrolments across states and institutions? Mr Hazlehurst: Yes.

Senator MASON: Could you give that to me across the 39 universities? I would be interested in that and I know Senator Nash would be for regional universities. Mr Hazlehurst: Yes, I think so, Senator.

Answer

The 2009 full year participation rates for students from low SES backgrounds at Table A universities are shown in the following table.

As part of the budget package for 2009-10 the Government announced that better measures of SES will be developed which are based on the circumstances of individual students and their families.

In consultation with the higher education sector, DEEWR has developed an interim indicator of low SES in higher education based on a combination of the Socioeconomic Index for Areas (SEIFA) Index of Education and Occupation (IEO) measure at the Census Collection District (CD) level and a Centrelink student payments measure. In the interim indicator, the CD measure has been assigned a weight of 2/3 and the Centrelink payments measure a 1/3 weight.
