Senator Carr asked on 5 November 2003:

Question:

There has been growing international concern at the effects of the global lack of knowledge about biodiversity and environmental destabilisation and particularly by a chronic shortage of expertise in taxonomy and systematics.

- (a) In the light of its international importance, why was there no funding for systematics research in this year's ARC Discovery Grants?
- (b) Can you confirm that biodiversity was a government priority area for funding this year?
- (c) Does that not make the lack of support for this area even more inexplicable?
- (d) Can you provide this Committee with a table showing the number and value of ARC Discovery grants addressing systematics research over the past four years, on a year-by-year basis?

Answer:

ARC funding for research in taxonomy and systematics

The ARC has provided the following response.

- (a) In 2004, the ARC will provide funding of \$1,361,574 for 20 *Discovery–Projects* grants (both new and continuing research projects). The 20 grants include five for which funding will commence in 2004.
- (b) There are four National Research Priorities of which one is entitled *An Environmentally Sustainable Australia*. One of the goals in this priority area relates to the understanding and sustainable use of Australia's biodiversity.
- (c) The ARC will continue to support high-quality research projects through *Discovery–Projects* and other schemes that encompass taxonomy and systematics study.
