Question:

- 1. One of the Government's stated reasons for closing this Scheme [the Student Financial Supplement Scheme] is that commercial loan packages are now readily available to students. Has the Government done any research on this, and if so, what were the findings?
- 2. Did the Government consult students before deciding to close down the scheme, and if so, what were the findings?
- 3. Is the Government planning on increasing student income support payments or introducing an additional payment if it succeeds in closing the scheme?
- 4. Would the Government consider supporting an amendment to this Bill, to ensure that current students are able to continue to receive the supplement until the end of their course?
