Question:

Please itemize all contracts, consultancies, grants, tenders, or secondments to the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ACCI) and/or its state branches, approved by the Minister's Department or an agency for which the Minister has portfolio responsibility, since May 1996, including:

(a) The Department or agency involved and;

(b) The (i) purpose, (ii) date of approval (iii) value or cost of the contract, grant or secondment and (iv) the outcomes.

Answer:

Contracts

There have been a number of significant Portfolio changes since 1996. The Education, Science and Training portfolio was formed by the Machinery of Government changes announced in November 2001 and therefore information relating to the Portfolio can only be provided from that time.

The Department and its agencies have identified 13 funding arrangements, 1 secondment and 1 services contract with the Australian Chamber or Commerce and Industry (ACCI) since November 2001. The details are contained in Attachment A.

We have received confirmation from ACCI that State Chambers are not branches or divisions of ACCI. They are members of ACCI but are separate, autonomous legal entities over which ACCI has no control.

CSIRO provided a nil response.
