**Answer:**

Information relating to Intensive Support – Job search Training, Job Placement Only, NEIS, Work for the Dole, IEP, including IEP-Wage Assistance and Transition to Work is attached. Outcomes at the Statistical Local Area are not readily available, as there are insufficient survey respondents to allow for the estimation of statistically reliable outcomes. A demographic breakdown by State for Job Placement, Intensive

Support – Job search training and Work for the Dole is not available for Tasmania, the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory for the same reason. Similarly, outcomes results for NEIS, IEP and Transition to Work which have relatively small numbers of participants are presented only at the State level.

Results for Self Employment Development Scheme (SEDS) and Community Development Employment Projects (CDEP) are not available: Following recommendations from the Productivity Commission review into Job Network, SEDS was discontinued from 1 July 2003; and CDEP participants are not included as part of the DEWR Post Programme Monitoring survey.

**Please note:** Work for the Dole is a Work Experience program and not a Labour Market Assistance program. The Department however have provided the figures for Work for the Dole as requested.
