# A LONGITUDINAL STUDY INTO WORK AND MANAGEMENT PRACTICES

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
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### REVISED TIMELINE

Below, we present a revised timetable that outlines the proposed timeline for the three year longitudinal study into work and management practices in the Australian Workplace Agreement (AWA) making process.



research project. As can be seen, the second and third year of the project involves the collection of survey data only.



As can be seen in the timeline for the second year of the project, we have allowed time to incorporate feedback from the previous year. In addition, in the second and third year of the project we will also analyse and report on the longitudinal data. As such, time to complete this additional element of the research project is also incorporated into the timeline.

The timeline for the third year of the project is outlined below. The timeline in the third year of the research project is identical to the timeline proposed for the second year, with the exception that we will also provide an analysis of the longitudinal findings for the entire period of the project.

	During the course of our research partnership with the OEA the Work Effectiveness team is likely to use a variety of survey items that have been developed by various team members in the past. The survey IP is currently held by a number of team members. For the duration of the tender the instrument will be licensed to OEA as necessary. Further use of the instrument can be negotiated via licensing arrangements.
	Additional items developed by the OEA and QUT are subject to a license provided by OEA to QUT to use the data in confidence for the purposes of research.
	B. Data License
	In order to meet university requirements, a license to use the data for research purposes is required. Negotiation around this point is possible. At all times QUT will honour the confidentiality and anonymity agreement presented in this offer.
	C. Scholarly articles
	The copyright of articles published in scholarly outlets is assigned to the authors of the material or the publishing body. Any scholarly articles published will hold to the confidentiality and privacy agreements relating to this tender.
