Question 3

During 2005, the Australian Government Quality Teacher Programme (AGQTP) was in transition between funding phases and was subsequently restructured following its evaluation in 2005.

Prior to 2006, the AGQTP provided funding on a financial year basis under the priority areas nominated in the question.

From 2006, the state and territory element of the programme is being delivered on a calendar year basis under three priority areas:

- curriculum,
- targeted learning needs, and
- cross curricular/whole school needs.

New guidelines are available at www.qualityteaching.dest.gov.au

The 2006 and 2007 funding amounts indicate anticipated expenditure by states and territories against these priority areas. Final reports with actual expenditure for 2006 are due in January 2007. The 2007 funding amounts are based on 2007 state and territory planned expenditure. There are no funding amounts by priority area for 2008 as education authorities submit annual plans for activities. The 2008 plan is due in November 2007.

Tasmania and the Northern Territory operate cross-sectorally, therefore data is not available by sector (i.e. Government, Catholic and Independent) for Tasmania and the Northern Territory.
