Senator Marshall asked in writing:

<u>Compliance</u> How many of these complaints resulted in prosecutions against employers by the Department? Please provide a breadown of these prosecutions by employee gender, employee age, occupation, industry, size of business, located (by state) and employment status (full-time, part-time, casual or independent contractor). Of these prosecutions, how many involved unpaid monies of (a) less than \$1000 (b) between \$1000 and \$5000 (c) between \$5000 and \$10000 (d) over \$10000

Answer:

Of the 21 prosecutions commenced by OWS at 1 November 2006, 15 involved underpayment of wages and entitlements for 267 employees of amounts totalling \$289,689.03 and involved 66 breaches. Of these prosecutions 4 were in the Australian Capital Territory, 9 were in Victoria and there is 1 each for New South Wales and Tasmania.
