### **Question:**

Senator Wong asked in writing:

<u>Work Choices Implementation Agencies - Alternative Dispute Resolution Assistance</u> Scheme.

Can an employer use ADRAS as a tactic to prolong disputes and terminate employees ?If an employee fails to follow the direction from an ADR procedure, can the employer terminate them if they have less than 100 workers ?

### **Answer:**

No. The Alternative Dispute Resolution Assistance Scheme simply provides financial assistance to facilitate choice in alternative dispute resolution services.

For employers with fewer than 100 employees the unlawful termination provisions of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* apply.
