Senator Wong asked in writing: <u>Personal Support Programme</u>. Are any highly disadvantaged people not deemed suitable for the program? What happens to them?

Answer:

Not all highly disadvantaged people will be assessed as suitable for the Personal Support Programme (PSP). A Job Capacity Assessment (JCA) provider may determine that another employment or pre-employment programme may be more suitable as a result of their assessment. Alternatively, JCA providers may recommend a complementary programme, such as the Language, Literacy and Numeracy Programme. For clients in crisis, JCA providers can refer these people for crisis assistance, with a subsequent referral to a suitable programme of assistance.
