Question

Workforce Participation criteria

Further to DEEWR Question No. EW0352_10 from 3 June 2009, please provide a break down of this information by Federal electorate, Australia-wide.

[Question No. EW0352_10 from 3 June 2009 requested information on regional and rural students who qualify for Youth Allowance through the workforce participation criterion. The response provided Centrelink administrative data on the recorded home addresses of young people who established their independence under the workforce participation criterion and who were granted Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY from the period April 2008 to April 2009. This data indicated that:

- 70 percent lived in a major cities;
- 21 percent lived in inner regional Australia;
- 8 percent lived in outer regional Australia; and
- the remaining 1 percent lived in remote or very remote Australia or did not have a post code recorded.]

Answer

Administrative data for current recipients of Youth Allowance at 24 April 2009, approved under the workforce participation criterion over the preceding 12 months, by Federal electorate is provided at <u>Attachment A</u>. A total of 32 008 full-time students and apprentices receiving Youth Allowance at 24 April 2009 qualified under the workforce participation criteria for independence over the preceding 12 months.
