ABSTUDY – at home and away from home

Senator SCULLION: I wonder if you could just take the at home and away from home elements on notice. Ms Milliken: Your earlier questions specifically about secondary students, so are you interested in whether the secondary are not in relation to this question or is it just generally in respect of ABSTUDY? Senator SCULLION: I am. My questions relate broadly to secondary school and to tertiary. Ms Paul: We should be able to break it down like that. Senator SCULLION: If you could break them into both of those, that would be very useful.
