The Program also supports improvement of primary health care services and aims to increase the proportion of skilled staff attendance at deliveries -- including hospital deliveries where high risk births have been identified. The immunization program continues to be strengthened using the GOS budget, and the Program is financing an immunization catch-up effort. Work is also being done on a credentialling system for nurses and midwives. Funding goes into a 'pooled fund' also containing funds from World Bank, and NZAID which are used to finance a whole range of activities, thus it is difficult to quantify contributions to maternal and child health in Samoa.
