In accordance with Section 9 of the CAC Act, DHA's 2005-06 Armual Report was provided to the responsible Minister on 13 October 2006, both an electronic and A4 printed format.

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Due to an unforeseen delay in the printing process, the final printed version was not available for tabling prior by 31 October 2006.

The report was tabled in both houses of the Parliament 'as soon as practicable' as required by section 9(3) of the CAC Act.

The DHA is not subject to the *Requirements for Annual Reports* approved by the Joint Committee of Public Accounts and Audit under subsections 63(2) and 70(2) of the *Public Service Act 1999*. Nevertheless, the Authority makes every effort to comply with the Government policy stated therein that all annual reports should be tabled by 31 October.

During the year, Defence Housing Australia (DHA) spent \$266,785 (excluding GST) on external general legal services, and \$711,840.40 (excluding GST) on property-related external legal services (eg conveyancing).

(2) What sum did the department spend on internal legal services.

The DHA's internal legal services were provided by a General Counsel. Salary and associated administrative expenses of the General Counsel in 2005/06 were \$137,344 (excluding GST).

(3) What is the department's projected expenditure on legal services for 2006-2007.

An amount of \$156,733 (excluding GST) has been budgeted for expenditure on DHA Legal Counsel services and associated administrative expenses in 2006/07 and an amount of \$475,000 for external general legal services in 2006/07.

Fees for property-related legal services are not budgeted separately as they are essentially demand-driven and included in the value of the asset which is the subject of the legal transaction.
