Senator Faulkner asked: Has the nature of the ceremony been consistent over the years?

Answer: The nature of the presentations of the Australian of the Year awards has varied from year to year. Prior to Australia Day 2003, the three main awards (Australian of the Year, Young Australian of the Year and Senior Australian of the Year) were presented at three separate ceremonies. The National Australia Day Council decided to restructure the awards programme for 2003 to bring together the presentation of the three awards in one ceremony, and to include a new Local Hero award. The presentation ceremony was broadcast on national television.
