Topic: Indigenous employment

Senator Crossin asked: Do you have any record of how many Indigenous officers

left after the closing of ATSIS and transfer of staff to mainstream departments?

Answer: The APS Employment Database (APSED) contains information on all

people employed under the Public Service Act. The provision of Indigenous status by

APS employees to their agency is voluntary, and as a consequence APSED data most

likely under-represents the number of Indigenous Australians employed in the APS.

In addition, this data includes ongoing employees only, as data is not routinely

collected for all non-ongoing employees.

A full audit of APSED data is conducted each year, for end of financial year

reporting. Interim data indicates that between 1 July 2004 and 31 December 2004, 10

ongoing ex-ATSIS Indigenous employees separated from the APS. For the same

period, 19 ongoing ex-ATSIS non-Indigenous employees separated.

This information should be seen as preliminary, and subject to variation. It is based on

interim data provided by agencies, and has not been verified. The verification process

will not be completed until June 2005 data is received from all agencies.
