The data that the snapshot was taken can be found in the heading above your data. All snapshot data is taken as at a particular month or quarter depending on the data source. For the purposes of this exercise, snapshots have been taken as close to 31 December 2005 as possible.

This answer required 33 hours and 10 minutes at a cost of \$1328.00 to prepare.
