a) Since November 2007, how many Blackberry/Personal Digital Assistants have been destroyed rather than re-deployed for use by Ministers and their staff across the Government?

If so:

- b) Why were they destroyed rather than redeployed?
- c) What was the cost of replacing these?
- d) Who destroyed these?
- e) Did the internal or external party responsible for destroying these have a security clearance?

Answer:

- a. In relation to the allocation of Personal Digital Assistants to Senators and Members under their electorate office entitlement, 53 devices have been replaced. To date, no Blackberrys, which is a form of Personal Digital Assistant, have been destroyed or re-deployed.
- b. Where the device was returned to the Department of Finance and Deregulation (Finance) it was destroyed if the device was both out of warranty and/or beyond repair. Where a device was reported lost, our help desk service provider, the Department of Parliamentary Services was responsible for ensuring the devices were remotely sanitised thus destroying the data contained thereon.
- c. The cost of replacing the destroyed devices is \$47,482.15 to date.
- d. As the data contained on these devices is rated as 'unclassified', Finance staff destroyed these devices.
- e. All internal Finance staff have a minimum security clearance of 'Protected'.
