ESTIMATES HEARING, 27 FEBRUARY 2009 - DEPARTMENT OF THE SENATE

SENATE COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

TRENDS DURING THE 41ST AND 42ND PARLIAMENTS

The attached statistics and tables show trends in the activities of Senate committees during the 41st and 42nd parliaments. The trends can be summarised as follows:

41st Parliament

- Reduction in numbers of references to committees
- No select committees appointed after 1 July 2005

As a consequence, with committees being less active, staff vacancies arising out of normal turnover were not filled. At the end of the parliament there were 7 staff vacancies.

42nd Parliament


- Increase in numbers of references to committees (the busiest committees with the most number of references have been Economics (maximum of 14 references at one time), Legal and Constitutional Affairs (maximum of 5 references at one time) and Community Affairs (maximum of 12 references at one time))
- This increase in activity is also reflected by the numbers of committee reports being tabled, with Economics tabling 30 reports and Community Affairs tabling 18 reports during 2008.
- Increase in the number of very short-term references (ie less than 2 weeks)
- Appointment of 6 select committees within a 12 month period

As a consequence, all staff vacancies were filled, with 12 new staff appointed within 8 months, a net increase of 7 staff.




Senate Committees - Number of References 1995 to 2008


Senate Select Committees Appointed - 1995 to 2008






COMMITTEE OFFICE STAFFING LEVELS





This explains why secretariat costs do not necessarily match workload levels. For example, the legally qualified staff on the Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee often help other secretariats with legal issues and questions.
