Answer

- 1 The Parliamentary Computing Network (**PCN**) web-filtering vendor maintains a database of websites that are blocked for various reasons.
- From time to time, the vendor updates its database, which may result in previously unblocked sites becoming blocked.
- 3 DPS can explicitly override a blocked site on request.
- A request to unblock <u>www.thepunch.com.au</u> was received on 14 December 2009. In actioning this request, the site was found to be unblocked by the vendor on 15 December. The site has been specifically unblocked by DPS in case the vendor recategorises it again.
- A request to unblock <u>www.metrotrains.com.au</u> was received on 11 January 2010. In actioning this request, the site was found to be unblocked by the vendor on 12 January. The site has been specifically unblocked by DPS in case the vendor recategorises it again.
