On the information that is currently accessible to the Department, there were three occasions under the previous government where requests to relocate an electorate office at the end of a lease were not approved:

Year	Senator/Member	Reason
1996	Member for Mitchell	Budgetary constraints
2003	Member for Lingiari (second office)	Considerable monies spent on the existing office within the previous three years
2007	Senator for Victoria	Higher than normal market cost for fitout of proposed office
