Senator BOYCE - Would you be able to provide me on notice the plan as it is going to be worked through, when the deadlines are for particular areas and how many eligible Centrelink recipients are in those areas.

Answer:

Australia is switching over to digital television (TV) on a region by region basis. The following timetable has been provided by the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy. It details when each of the 33 TV Broadcasting Licence Areas is proposed to switchover to digital TV in the eight, phased-switchover periods over four years.

Currently, there are approximately 1.9 million maximum rate Centrelink and Department of Veterans' Affairs households across Australia that may be eligible for the Household Assistance Scheme. Centrelink is administering the Scheme on behalf of the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy.

As at 16 February 2010, there were approximately 7,000 eligible households for the Scheme in the Mildura TV licence area. On 19 January 2010, an invitation letter with an information pamphlet about the Household Assistance Scheme was sent to 8,485 Centrelink customers and 823 Department of Veterans' Affairs customers in the Mildura TV licence area. The letter asked customers to contact Centrelink to test their eligibility for the Scheme. This letter will be sent to eligible households in the other TV licence areas during the relevant switchover period. In the above timetable, the end date shown in the 'Window' column is the planned date for ceasing analogue transmission in each area, as advised by the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy.

The Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy, in consultation with Centrelink and the Department of Veterans' Affairs, estimates that there are another 240,000 potentially eligible households in the regional South Australia, regional Victoria and regional Queensland TV switchover areas in total. More detailed breakdowns, and figures for the remaining roll out areas, are yet to be determined.

As customers' circumstances often change, the exact numbers of potentially eligible households for the Scheme in each switchover area are not known until immediately prior to the mail out of the invitation letter.
