Senator FIFIELD—Which is \$55,000 for arts consultancy services from 20 July 2010 to 2 September 2010.

Mr Thompson—I am not aware of any expenditure over that short period. We have a longer term appointment which Merryn Gates fulfils, but it is certainly not a figure like that over two or three months.

Senator FIFIELD—Could you advise what the purpose of that consultancy is and if those details are correct.¹

Answer

- 1 DPS contracts a qualified independent consultant to identify artworks suitable for addition to the Parliament House Art Collection (**PHAC**). In nominating works for acquisition, the consultant:
 - (a) has regard to the acquisition policy and collecting priorities (if any) nominated by the Art Advisory Committee (AAC); and
 - (b) works to an annual acquisitions budget.
- Where the consultant nominates a work for acquisition, she provides a completed proposal form for consideration by the AAC and, if requested, attends a meeting of the AAC to discuss the proposed acquisition.
- 3 DPS has an ongoing need for the services of the art consultant, given the approval by the Presiding Officers of a new three-year plan for art acquisitions.
- The current consulting services contract has a value of \$55,000, for the period September 2010 to September 2011. Unfortunately the dates were listed in AusTender incorrectly. This has now been rectified.
