a) Are there any plans for staff reduction? If so, please advise details including if there is a reduction target, how this will be achieved, & if any services/programs will be cut.

b) If there are plans for staff reductions, please give the reason why these are happening.

Answer

- a) The 2012–13 Portfolio Budget Statement has set an average staffing level at 702, a further reduction of 18 FTE compared to June 2012. DPS is currently undertaking workforce planning analysis, rather than a strict budgetary analysis, to determine if this target can or should be met. This involves assessing positions when they are vacated to determine if the duties could be reassigned to another staff member(s), done on a part-time basis, abolished or redesigned to be more effective.
- b) While natural attrition will be used as the main mechanism to meet the PBS staffing target, DPS cannot rule out offering voluntary redundancies through re-alignment processes or through the need to address budget constraints. A systematic approach will be taken to determine the best method to manage DPS's average staffing levels.
