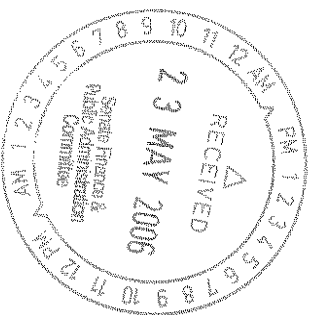


Approved Family Violence Partnership Programme projects for which project funding agreements have been signed as at 23 May 2006.
