Topic: Centrelink – Data on Parenting Payment, Disability Support Pension, Newstart and Youth Allowance

Written Question on Notice: 24/05/07

SENATOR SIEWERT asked on 24/05/2007:

- 1. For a Question on Notice from Additional Estimate, HS40, Centrelink replied that the information required to answer Parts 1-8 of the question is not readily available, can Centrelink explain why the Centrelink data collection process is not able to readily breakdown each of the following characteristics and if it can provide some of the data, what data it is able to provide, for:
 - a. the numbers of Parenting Payment recipients by age of youngest child, family status (PPS or PPP) and employment status (employment or not employed), by State?
 - b. the numbers of Disability Support Pension by employment status, payment status ('transititonal group' and other), State?
 - c. the numbers of Newstart and Youth Allowance recipients by employment status, principal carer status, partial capacity to work status, those exempted from activity requirements, (including specifically: temporary exemptions for parents), by duration on those payment (less than 1 year, 1 year and less than 2, 2 years and less than 5, 5 years or more), State?
- 2. Can Centrelink explain why its data collection process cannot readily provide data on how many people had lodged appeals to "first" and "second" participation failures and "8 week penalties" and that information by State/Territory?
- 3. Can Centrelink explain why its data collection process cannot readily provide data on the outcomes of appeals to participation failures and "8 week penalties" and that data by State/Territory and in how many of these cases were customers paid pending appeal?
- 4 Can Centrelink explain why its data collection process cannot readily provide data on the average time for the National Participation Solutions Team to decide on a participation failure and issue correspondence to the customer?

Answer:

Centrelink is able to provide a response to parts 1a, 1b and 1c of the question following resource allocation extending beyond the timeframe available to complete HS40.

Centrelink is unable to readily provide a response to parts 2 and 3 as there are no special reasons recorded in Centrelink systems that specifically identify appeals against first or second failures, or appeals against "eight-week penalties" as opposed to appeals against failures in general. All appeals against failures are recorded under the general category of "failure". Given the lack of a direct data link, obtaining this information would be highly resource intensive (in excess of 50 hours to extract).

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Centrelink is unable to readily provide a response to part 4 as information on when correspondence relating to failure is issued to a customer by the National Participations Solutions Team is not recorded in a way that allows it to be linked to the participation failure that prompted it. Consequently, obtaining this information would be highly resource intensive (in excess of 50 hours to extract).
