- 5. Has an assessment been undertaken of the costs of Australia's participation in any such research programme?
- 6. Has an allocation been made for the research programme in the Budget?
- 7. If so how much and over what time frame?
- 8. If not, how can the government make such a commitment without foreshadowing the Budget implications?
- 9. Which agency or Department is responsible for carriage of this matter?
- 10. Which agency has/or will have carriage of this research development in Australia?
- 11. If actual dollars are allocated which is the likely programme or agency to fund such research?
- 12. On what scientific basis is the Prime Minister's announcement based?
- 13. Has an assessment of this technology been undertaken?
- 14. Has an assessment of the proliferation risks been undertaken?
- 15. In what ways is Australia involved in Generation IV reactors?
- 16. Will the Lucas Heights Research Facility be involved in the development of Generation IV reactors?
