Senator RYAN—Could you take on notice and table for the committee the criteria by which—or the brief—you have asked websites to be blocked, so that I might have a chance to look at that?

Answer

- 1 The web filtering software for DPS has a standard set of categories of websites to block.
- 2 The categories are:
 - (a) "Computers/Harmful" which includes websites that can be harmful or annoying to the visiting computer. These include advertisements, hacking, password cracking applications, potentially malicious software, and spyware.
 - (b) "Adult" which includes adult/mature content, gambling, illegal drugs, pornography, violence/hate/racism and weapons.
 - (c) "Social" which includes games.
