## **Answer:**

In February 2010 the Office advertised in APSjobs (Gazette), SEEK and on the Office website for an Executive Administrative Assistant (EA to the Official Secretary). A total of twelve applications were received, of which four were shortlisted for interview by a selection panel. As a result of the selection process and referee reports, an offer of employment was made and the current incumbent commenced duty on 3 May 2010.

In September 2009, the Office advertised for an Assistant Speechwriter/Research Officer. A total of 26 applications was received. Due to internal reconsideration of how best to meet the needs of the Office going forward, the process was discontinued. In January 2010 the then Speechwriter indicated her wish to pursue other interests outside the Office and tendered her resignation effective 19 February 2010. The Office considered various approaches for staffing the speechwriting function, including engaging a panel of providers. However, the individual who had been undertaking contract speechwriting work for the Office indicated an interest in filling the role on a full time basis. As that individual was considered an outstanding candidate with all of the skills and experience required, and having only recently tested the market, an offer of full time employment under the Governor-General Act was made and accepted, with the incumbent commencing duty on 22 February 2010.
