The Archives' response:

- a) i. Staffing numbers are managed in accordance with the resources provided through the budget process. The numbers of staff fluctuate overtime for a number of reasons, including but not limited to changes in appropriation or strategic priorities.
 - ii. No, there has been a small increase in the number of staff (headcount of 8, non-ongoing and casual/intermittent positions) since February 2010.
- b) Not applicable as there was not a reduction in staff numbers.
- c) Staff reductions will be required to support the decision for the co-location of Archives' services with state and territory bodies. The number of staff reductions is dependant on the outcome of negotiations on the appropriate service model in each State and Territory.
- d) Apart from co-location the National Archives has not been required to achieve any further efficiencies in the 2010-11 budget.
- e) The Archives does not currently have graduate, cadetship or similar programs.
