* the 'Sisters' refers to a documentary which includes the Governor-General and is a major feature in the Australian Pavilion at the Shanghai World Expo. Expected to be seen by around 70 million people during the course of Expo, the documentary features leading Australian and Chinese women who are leaders in their fields and their inclusion in the visit brought some of the women together to discuss issues relating to science, sustainability, medicine and agriculture. The participation of the 'Sisters' delegation enhanced the Governor-General's meeting and activities in

Shanghai and Beijing thereby contributing to the deepening of Australia's cultural and scientific links with China (Australia's largest trading partner).

- e) The primary purpose of the Governor-General's visit to China was to represent Australia at the Australian National Day at the World Expo in Shanghai and to launch the 'Year of Australian Culture in China'. Her program incorporated several senior-level bilateral meetings, including with Vice-President, His Excellency Mr Xi Jinping, and with Chinese and Australian business representatives, underscoring China's importance as Australia's largest export market and trading partner. The 'Year of Australian Culture in China' will progressively showcase Australian art, music, dance and other cultural pursuits throughout the country. The visit comprised 39 official engagements over six days.

- g) Pudong Shangri-la in Shanghai and St Regis Hotel in Beijing, as guests of the Chinese Government.
- h) i) As per established practice RAAF SPA costs will be tabled by the Department of Defence in due course.
 - ii) The Chinese Government met accommodation costs for the Governor-General and Mr Bryce and several Government House staff. Other accommodation costs met by the Office are yet to be finalised.
 - iii) The Chinese Government met ground transportation costs for the Governor-General and Mr Bryce several Government House staff. Other ground transportation costs are yet to be finalised.
 - iv) Official gift costs are met by the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet.
 - v) Official hospitality costs are yet to be finalised.
 - vi) Any other costs associated with the trip are yet to be finalised.
