For the period 1 July 2011 to 30 April 2012 the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (PM&C) spent \$87,138.41 (GST inclusive) on official hospitality; this includes some expenditure on Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting related events that were hosted by Ministers. Details are provided at <u>Attachment A</u>.

In the rare case that entertainment costs are incurred by PM&C the costs are not recorded separately from official hospitality.

The Prime Minister's official hospitality is provided through funding appropriated for State Occasions and Official Visits and Ceremonial Hospitality (CERHOS). For the period 1 July 2011 to 30 April 2012 \$329,236.49 (GST inclusive) was paid through the State Occasions and Official Visits function for the Prime Minister's official hospitality. Details are provided at Attachment B.

In line with the government's policy decision announced at the Mid-Year Economic and Fiscal Outlook the department will look at improving efficiency by reductions in agency spend on official hospitality and entertainment where appropriate.
