Answer:

- 1. No cost has been incurred to provide press clippings to the Minister's office for this financial year to date.
- 2. The total cost of media monitoring services provided to the Australian Public Service Commission for this financial year to date (excluding GST) is \$77,800.
 - These services are provided by Media Monitors
 - The budget to provide this service for the year 2011-12 was \$53,000 excluding GST. The media monitoring costs above budget in 2011-12 were due to APS agreement making which attracted considerable media attention over the past 12-18 months. It is expected that expenditure in this area will decrease over the coming year.
 - The total cost of providing these services this financial year to date is \$77,800 (excluding GST).
