- a. What is the department/agency's guidelines on study?
- b. For this financial year to date, detail all education expenses (i.e. in house courses and tertiary studies) for each portfolio department and agency. Include what type of course, the total cost, cost per participant, the employment classification of each participant, how many participants and the amount of study leave granted to each participant (provide a breakdown for each employment classification). Also include the reason for the study and how it is beneficial for the department/agency.

Answer

- a) DPS provides studies assistance support for ongoing and non-ongoing employees. There are three categories for assistance:
 - i. Category A: study directly related to the employee's duties;
 - ii. Category B: study that will assist an employee with their career development in DPS or the Parliamentary Service; or
 - iii. Category C: general study where the skills and knowledge will be some of assistance to an employee's current duties or assist in career development.

A maximum of 70 hours paid study leave is available to approved employees over one semester.

- b) For the period 1 July 2012 to 31 March 2013, a total of 31 employees received studies assistance.
 - i. twenty for study that directly related to the employee's duties;
 - ii. eight for study that will assist an employee with their career development in DPS or the Parliamentary Service; and
 - iii. three for general study where the skills and knowledge will be some of assistance to an employee's current duties or assist in career development.

Details of educational expenses provided by DPS for the period 1 July 2012 to 31 March 2013 are listed in the tables below.
