What has been the total sum of appropriations that have been rephased under the new accrual accounting framework?

#### **Answer:**

Finance has no authority to approve requests to rephase expenditure programmes. The Minister for Finance and Administration approves rephasings. Funding for rephased programmes is appropriated in the relevant Budget or Additional Estimates bills, which are subject to passage by the Parliament.
