Senator Bernardi asked:

Regarding the closures of the Electoral Education Centres in Adelaide and Melbourne:

- a) Can you update me on the progress of these closures?
- b) Of the staff who were employed at these two centres, how many were relocated?
- c) Did any individuals lose their jobs? If so, how many?

Answer:

a) The Adelaide and Melbourne Electoral Education Centres closed on 30 June 2009. The AEC is in the process of decommissioning both centres and examining options for the integration and re-use of the software/hardware.

The Australian Government Solicitor (AGS) and the AEC's national property staff are exploring options regarding lease agreements for the Melbourne EEC, including negotiating a shortening in the term of the lease, assigning the lease to another tenant, and sub-leasing the site. The AEC will use the space vacated by the EECs in Adelaide and Melbourne for election and redistribution activities, thereby achieving savings for other programs.

- b) Of the seven ongoing staff employed at the Adelaide and Melbourne Electoral Education Centres, two have been permanently relocated into other ongoing, atlevel positions within the AEC in Victoria.
- c) Five of the seven ongoing staff employed at the Adelaide and Melbourne EECs have opted to take a voluntary redundancy. The last voluntary redundancy process should conclude in early December 2009.
