Senator BOYCE – With regards to Indigenous Australians who receive unemployment benefits in the form of Newstart or Youth Allowance, how many Indigenous people are on "work experience" in order to qualify for unemployment benefits, broken down to numbers in each state and territory?

Answer:

The response to this question is based on data provided by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR).

For the period 1 July 2009 to 24 January 2010, for those job seekers who are identified in the DEEWR system as Indigenous, 15,040 Indigenous job seekers on Newstart or Youth Allowance have participated in one or more Work Experience Activities. The number excludes job seekers who have exited Job Services Australia.
