Mr Lewis-Senator, it is not a level. It is just the name of an appointment.

Senator ABETZ-All right.

#### Answer:

As at 30 June 2007 PM&C had 35 substantive SES undertaking core functions; as at 30 June 2010 PM&C had 61 substantive SES undertaking core functions.

Changes to SES staffing levels during this period have been in line with additional functions established in the Department arising from Government decisions and requirements including:

- an enhanced role in the coordination of national security;
- new policy functions such as social inclusion, privacy policy, freedom of information and community cabinet;
- strategic policy advice and delivery capability;
- other coordination and administration roles; and
