- a) Has the NSCC met since the election? If so, on how many occasions has it met?
- b) Who attends the NSCC?
- c) Who is responsible for chairing the meetings?
- d) If the Prime Minister and the Deputy Prime Minister are both absent from the meeting who then is responsible for chairing the meetings?
- e) In response to answers to questions on notice about the former Prime Minister "Due to competing commitments the Prime Minster has, on a small number of occasions, delegated the chair if the National Security Committee to the Deputy Prime Minister or other Senior minister."
- i. On how many occasions has the delegation taken place?
- f) Has there ever been an occasion in 2008, 2009 and 2010 when the meeting has been chaired by a representative from either the Prime Minister or the Deputy Prime Minister? If so, when? By whom?
- g) How many times did the NSCC meet in 2008, 2009, 2010?
- h) Are records kept of attendance? Do those records include the staffers of the members of the committee?
- i) Can those records of attendance be tabled?

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- j) At any stage, was the work of the committee compromised due to the lateness or absence of the then Prime Minister Rudd and or Deputy Prime Minister?
- k) On any occasion in 2008, 2009, 2010, did Mr Rudd's Chief of Staff, Alister Jordan or another member of his staff, deputise for Mr Rudd on the committee?

Answer:

- a) Yes. As at 22 November, the National Security Committee of Cabinet (NSC) has met four times since the 2010 election.
- b) Ms Gillard (Chair), Mr Swan (Deputy Chair), Mr Rudd, Mr Smith, Mr Bowen, Mr McClelland and Mr O'Connor. Senator Wong for items with financial implications. Mr Clare for Defence capability items.
- c) The Prime Minister.
- d) The Minister for Foreign Affairs.
- e) (i) Whenever the Prime Minister was not present the meeting was chaired by either the Deputy Prime Minister or another senior minister.

- g) The NSC met 22 times in 2008, 26 in 2009 and to date 18 times in 2010.
