- a) Has the department instituted any policies or protocols that restrict or deny staff the use of Youtube; online social media, such as Facebook, MySpace and Twitter; and access to online discussions forums and blogs? If yes, please explain what restrictions has been put in place. Why were these restrictions put in place?

Answer:

- a) The department allows its users open access to some social media sites, including Facebook, MySpace, Blogger and YouTube. Most online forums and blogs are also accessible, depending on content. A user's access to any social media site is limited to 60 minutes in a 24 hour period. Access is also denied to websites that are considered inappropriate. These restrictions on content are in place to protect the network from potentially malicious code, protect users from illegal activity, and to prevent misuse of the system.

- c) Monitoring indicates sites are most accessed early morning and lunchtime.
- d) The Department monitors all Internet use and modifies its access policies to meet emerging issues or resource constraints.
