The total is comprised of airfares (\$0.13 million) and accommodation, meals and incidentals (\$0.13 million). - c) Yes. AEC staff are required to obtain approval for all travel, including if required, approval for flights other than the cheapest one identified as allowed under the Government's policy. The AEC's travel provider provides monthly reports on use of lowest practical fare.
- d) All AEC SES officers and PEOs are entitled to airline lounge memberships at the AEC's cost. For non-SES staff, memberships are only granted on a case-by-case basis where a demonstrated benefit to the agency exists, or to meet Workplace Health and Safety responsibilities. Costs for membership are as per the corporate scheme rates provided by Qantas, and the current private membership rates advertised by Virgin Australia.
