Question:

- i. For the financial year 2011-2012, how many kilowatt hours of electricity did the Department consume? What was the total cost?
- ii. What does this cost work out to per employee?
- iii. What increases in electricity costs has the Department experienced since the introduction of the carbon tax?
- iv. How has this changed the Department's spending pattern? What programs or services have been cut to meet the increased costs?
- v. What measures is the Department taking to reduce its electricity expenditure? When did these commence? What impact have they had?

Answer:

- The Department's electricity consumption for the financial year 2011-2012 was 1,912,110 kWhs. Arts and Sport Group consumption for this period will be provided separately by the Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sport.
 - Information on the total cost is provided in response to PM136.
- ii. The electricity cost for financial year 2011-2012 was approximately \$423 per employee.
- iii. The total increase in electricity costs for One National Circuit, Barton from June 2012 to July 2012 was approximately 33%. For the July 2012 invoice, 11.92% was due to the Carbon Pricing Scheme. All other increases are due to other factors such as increases in unit prices and consumption.

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- iv. Due to early notification by the Department's electricity provider of the expected impact of the carbon pricing scheme, the Department was able to factor the increase into the 2012-13 internal budget process. The Department has also implemented a number of energy saving initiatives as outlined below.
- v. The Department's primary office accommodation at One National Circuit, Barton was constructed in 2007 with energy efficiency as a key design feature, including an advanced building management and lighting control system. The building currently operates at a 4.5 star NABERS energy efficiency rating. Between 2007 and 2012 the Department has introduced a number of energy saving initiatives and these include:
 - o Lights on timers within meeting rooms
 - o Light switches within meeting rooms and breakout areas to allow occupants to turn lights off when they leave the room.
 - o Movement sensors controlling lights within offices and work pods
 - o Introduction of energy efficient computers

For the first three months of 2012-13, the Department's energy consumption at One National Circuit is 3.5% lower than for the same period in 2011-12.
