Answer:

During 2011-12 financial year, two documents were printed and presented to the parliament/public by the Australian Public Service Commission (APSC); the APSC Annual Report 2010-11 and the State of the Service Report 2010-11. The total cost to print these documents was \$31,955 GST inclusive.

The APS Remuneration Report 2011 was made available to the public in June 2012 as an online document. No hard copies were printed
