How many consultancies were undertaken in 2011-12? Identify the name of the consultant, the subject matter of the consultancy, the duration and cost of the arrangement, and the method of procurement (ie. open tender, direct source, etc). Also include total value for all consultancies.

#### **Answer:**

In 2011-12 the Commission paid a total of five consultants, to a total value of \$411,603.22 (GST incl):

- a. Dawn O'Neil Consulting
  - i. Subject: To assist the Commission in consulting on and developing a three-year Strategic Plan
  - ii. Duration: 1 month
  - iii. Cost: \$26,584.28 (GST incl on travel only)
  - iv. Procurement method: Direct Source
- b. Healthcare Management Advisors
  - i. Subject: To assist in the development of the National Report Card on Mental Health and Suicide Prevention
  - ii. Duration: 2 months
  - iii. Cost: \$363,598 (GST incl)
  - iv. Procurement method: Tender
- c. Richard Matthews Consulting
  - i. Subject: Provide planned and ad-hoc expert and technical advice
  - ii. Duration: 4 months
  - iii. Estimated cost: \$1,430 (GST incl)
  - iv. Procurement method: Direct Source

## d. Primary Communication

i. Subject: Assist in the development of a communications strategy

ii. Duration: 2.5 months

iii. Estimated cost: \$9,997.02 (GST incl) iv. Procurement method: Direct Source

## e. Gregor Henderson

i. Subject: To provide mental health advice from international perspective

ii. Duration: 12 months

iii. Estimated cost: \$9,993.92 (GST not payable)
