- c) What was the estimated value of fraud for referrals accepted?

  - ii) In each case
- d) What was the total estimated value of fraud for referrals rejected?
  - i) In total
  - ii) In each case
- e) How many external fraud investigations were completed?
- f) What was the total revenue awarded to customs for external fraud investigations completed?

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- a) 2,497.
- b) 459. 387 cases involved community protection goods that have no fraud value. Of the remaining 72, the estimated value of fraud for 35 cases is outlined in the table below and the value is still being calculated in 37 cases.
