Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 13 February 2007:

The October-December 2006 quarterly average on-time reporting rate was 93.2% for air cargo and 83.1% for sea cargo, how many twenty-foot equivalent containers does this represent?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

Air cargo is not transported in shipping containers and consequently data pertaining to twenty –foot equivalent containers is not available for air cargo.

Sea cargo reporting statistics are based on the reporting of bills of lading to Customs. A single bill of lading may cover several shipping containers or alternatively, several bills of lading may cover several unrelated consignments included in a single container. Consequently, Customs does not have a report available which provides an accurate count of the number of twenty-foot equivalent containers the on-time cargo reports represent.
