Senator Barnett asked the following question at the hearing on 18 February 2008:

Please provide a summary of the activities and the contributions that are made by agencies involved in joint activities with the Australian Crime Commission.

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

The ACC continues to initiate and maintain highly effective relationships with all state and territory jurisdictions and partner agencies through ongoing partnerships in numerous operations, task forces and intelligence projects.

As at 31 January 2008, there were 59 joint/multi-agency operations.
