Dear Dr Hawke

The National Capital Authority (NCA) has recently completed a feasibility study looking at the possible upgrade of the existing buoyed rowing course in Lake Burley Griffin at Yarramundi Reach to an international standard "Championship" course.

The NCA undertook the feasibility study following the completion of its Planning Framework that reviewed existing planning policies in the western reaches of Lake Burley Griffin in 2006.

The Planning Framework identified a range of options in relation to existing and future land and water uses at Yarramundi Reach including the possibility of upgrading the existing rowing course. The feasibility study examined many of the physical and operational requirements of an international standard or "Championship" rowing course. It determined that an upgraded rowing course is technically feasible although the costs of lake edge reshaping are considerable and the potential for impacts on a range of lake values would need to be further assessed.

I thought this initial work would be of interest to you in terms of your involvement with the adjacent Lindsay Pryor National Arboretum and as such I have attached a copy of the report for your consideration. It is important to note that the study in itself is not intended as a proposal for a course upgrade but to identify the key issues that are likely to arise should a proposal be developed.
